## Huggate News circulation

It has been decided that as it is still thought safe to receive items of post, it is more important to maintain communication in the village than to cancel circulation. Science guidance (eg <https://www.livescience.com/how-long-coronavirus-last-surfaces.html>) suggests that virus can persist for up to 24 hours on paper and cardboard and longer on hard surfaces such as letter boxes, so if you are concerned, sanitise hands after picking up post, then leave it untouched for a day.

We will not be delivering paper copies to anyone who is known to receive by email (some addresses on our list have not been identified by residence address). Would anyone else who does NOT want to receive future paper copies at this time notify us by email or phone.

**If guidelines change, we may not be able to deliver again for a while, so if you would like to be added to the email circulation list, either permanently or temporarily, please send in your email address. It will not be used for any purpose other than circulating Huggate News.**

## BREAD MAKING without yeast

It seems that some of the people who are now buying bread flour are unable to get hold of baker's yeast to make bread.

Much nicer bread (and buns, pizzas etc.) can be made with sourdough, which literally only needs flour and water to set up; google eg <https://www.sourdoughbread.co.uk/guides-your-starter/> Ignore any complicated versions that tell you to use yoghurt, grated apple or whatever; just harvest the local wild yeasts and make your own unique Huggate bread. Or, I have a flourishing decades old starter culture and will gladly pass on a dollop to anyone who would like it.

Sourdough bread does take time—but a lot of people have that just now, and it is worth the effort.
