The Councillors would like to invite everyone to come along to plant snowdrops and other suitable flowers to improve the appearance of the lower soak away pond. Please bring gardening tools with you and there will be sausage butties for all helpers!

The weekly Post Office is once again up and running at Suddaby's, Church Farm, Main Street every Tuesday afternoon from 2 – 4pm which is a useful service within village.

Huggate has its own defibrillator located at the Wolds Inn Pub and defibrillator training has been arranged for Tuesday 10th December at 7 pm in the pub; this is open to everyone and could save a life. We appreciate that this date and time may not suit everyone, therefore if you would like a second training session to be arranged e.g. during the day, then please email the clerk at the same address and if there is sufficient interest a further session will be arranged.

To further improve communication in Huggate the Councillors are going to set up a whatsapp group which will be used for information purposes only. It is hoped that this could be useful to aid communication amongst themselves and relay useful information to parishioners particularly in the event of bad weather. It will be administrated by the clerk and will be on a trial basis, where a review of its effectiveness will take place in 6 months' time.
