Parish Council News

Due to 'stay at home' request and Government guidelines re: social distancing there was no Parish Council meeting in April and meetings will continue to be cancelled for as long as the measures are in operation.

We have an update regarding the Traffic Calming Gateways that were planned at entrances to the village.... unfortunately ERYC have refused permission to go ahead with this. Their findings show 'insufficient evidence to consider or support requests for traffic calming measures in Huggate'. Earlier this year ERYC also denied our request for additional speed signage from them. We are now researching the cost and effectiveness of Parish Council using precept funds to purchase radar speed monitors (or something similar). Even if this seems practical we will still require ERYC approval!

On a positive note..... the village WhatsApp group is running activities such as:- Remote Quiz on a Friday evening at 7.30pm courtesy of Peter Cowan (The Island), connection is via zoom link. Quiz Trophy donated by Ken (Hobson's Jewellers) is passed on to each week's winner. Art Competitions – which started with children's Easter theme, quickly followed by adult Easter competition and continued with Wildlife picture/photography theme again in the two categories (children/adults). This competition is looking to continue for a while with themes changing weekly. The entries are uploaded to Huggate Village facebook page and the number of likes on each entry determines the winners. Thank you to Emma Waslin for instigating the competition and her presentation skills with the hampers and prizes. Thanks also to Gemma, Rachel and Maree for their parts and many thanks to those residents who kindly donated to enhance and/or provide future prizes.

Wash your hands of coronavirus scams!

Friends Against Scams aims to protect and prevent people from becoming victims of scams.

Be aware of people offering or selling:

- Virus testing kits - these are only offered by NHS.
- Vaccines or miracle cures - there is currently no vaccine or cure.
- Overpriced or fake goods to protect yourself from coronavirus such as anti-bacterial products.
- Shopping or medication collection services.
- Home cleaning services.

Protect yourself and others:

- Don't be rushed into making a decision. If it sounds too good to be true it probably is.
- Only purchase goods from legitimate retailers and take a moment to think before parting with money or personal information.
- Don't assume everyone is genuine. It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.
- If someone claims to represent a charity, ask them for ID. Be suspicious of requests for money up front. If someone attempts to pressurise you into accepting a service they are unlikely to be genuine. Check with family and friends before accepting offers of help if you are unsure.

Be a good friend, help to protect your family, friends and neighbours from scams.

Read it. Share it. Prevent it.
