Thank you to everyone who came along to help with planting bulbs around the pond and green areas – it was lovely to see so many children taking part. We look forward to seeing the results in Spring!

There is an **Outreach Post Office** service every Tuesday from 2-4pm at Church Farm. The Councillors are keen to support Kevin who comes from Nafferton Post Office each week and would like to remind parishioners to please make use of this valuable service. You can pay in cash/cheques, withdraw cash, post and return parcels (that you would normally take to a post office), renew car tax – all without having to leave the comfort of Huggate! We are keen to promote the Post Office service *and you will hopefully soon see an A board outside the farm to show where he is located which the Parish Council are providing*. If, for any reason, the Post Office service isn't able to go ahead e.g. due to a technical failure then we will endeavour to let parishioners know as soon as possible via the WhatsApp information group.

The Councillors were excited that work had started on installing the **new basket swing on the village green**. Due to some feedback that the Parish Council have received, the completion has been postponed until a post installation assessment has been carried out and (at the time of writing) we are kindly asking children to refrain from playing on the site until this has been completed. The basket seat will be attached for use once all is complete. We hope to have things finalised very soon!



The People's Pantry was established in March 2018, to fight food poverty and reduce food waste in Market Weighton, Pocklington, Holme on Spalding Moor and the surrounding areas of the East Riding of Yorkshire. The aim is to help support local individuals and families who are struggling to put food on their table and, at the same time, reduce the amount of surplus food going to waste.

Run by volunteers, we rely on the kindness and generosity of local residents and businesses and other local charitable organisations for donations of food, toiletries and cleaning products, for which we are most grateful.

Prior to the current pandemic, we operated open sessions at each of our three venues however we are now operating an appointment and delivery service in order to protect our service users and volunteers.
