Parish Council News

The Parish Council held their May meeting adhering to social distancing. Further to George Fuller's resignation there are now vacancies for **anyone interested in becoming a Councillor**. You need to have either lived or worked within the Parish for the past 12 months and whilst the official process with East Riding Council is currently on hold, if you are interested please email Abby at clerk-huggate@outlook.com for more information or have a chat with any of our current Councillors (their details are on the notice board and village website). Once we have the go ahead to proceed with filling the vacancy, we will do so.

We have received confirmation that due to COVID-19 we do not need to have an **annual meeting** this year; Jill Cussans Adams will remain as our Chairperson and Jane Leaver as Vicechair.

We received 65 responses to the **Village Questionnaire** – a big thank you to everyone who took the time to complete this. Councillors agreed that another **defibrillator training session** will be run at some point as 22 people were interested in either a daytime or evening session. Councillors agreed to continue contributing to the printing costs of **Huggate News** as 91% of respondents are in favour of this.

The email circulation list includes a number of email addresses for which the recipient and their house address are not known. If you've opted to receive Huggate News by email but are still receiving paper copies, please let us know (huggatenews@btinternet.com) so that we can cut down on unwanted paper duplicates. Also if you would like to receive the Huggate News by email in future please send in your email address (with your house address!).

Huggate News is also available on the Village Website- www.huggatevillage.org/huggate-news so there are various options to save on paper and (more expensive!) toner.

88% of the 65 responses were in support of purchasing a **basket swing** and seeking funding for this, as you may have seen on the WhatsApp group, a new group of villagers have re-formed the village amenities project group to progress with investigating the purchase of this and / or the possibility of a playground area.

Thank you to the 5 people who expressed an interest in becoming a **First Responder**, due to the small number of volunteers, unfortunately there isn't enough people to make this viable for the village.

All of your comments were discussed and appropriate actions were agreed. **Speeding** remains a particular concern to the village and the Councillors are continuing to investigate solutions.

Thank you again to those who kindly cut the grass during the period where ERYC was unable to do so: Richard Knocker, Paul Hoggard, Steve and Moria Poole, Will and Robert Hobson and everyone else who has kept the village looking so tidy. ERYC resumed their **grass cutting** last week and our thanks have been passed on to the 'one man' on his mower (there's a song in there somewhere, except he was mowing a green not a meadow!) for doing an excellent job.

Thank you to Tom, & Ali Bilton who **donated money (to the village)** from recent sales of their tlc pizzas in Huggate. The Councillors have decided to use the money for buying new flowers and shrubs to put in the additional planters at the entrances to the village. Therefore, thank you to anyone who bought a pizza, and many thanks to all the Bilton team!

ERYC has asked us to make you aware of a new **tree planting fund** available to private and public landowners, farmers, schools and businesses across East Riding. The purpose is to create new areas of woodland, plant new clusters of native trees or establish new individual native standard trees. Grants are available up to £3000 and more information can be found Diane Howard, Development Services Assistant at ERYC (diane.howard@eastriding.gov.uk)
