# HUGGATE NEWS

February 2021



St Mary's Church has stood in Huggate for probably over 900 years. We are the latest generation to enjoy it; and the latest to have the task of caring for what is now a Grade 1 listed building. Grade 1 listing means that it is of "exceptional interest", in the top 2.5% of the nation's historic buildings.

The QI (Quinquennial Inspection), a five yearly assessment of the condition of the church building and grounds, was carried out in November by the internationally renowned firm of architects, Arup.

At 87 pages, the report is comprehensive if a little daunting but provides a basis for maintaining the building and developing facilities, to carry it forward towards its millennium. There is major work to be done on the stonework inside and out and extensive

repair needed to the roofs of the side aisles and chancel. The main roof seems to be in reasonable condition but may need reslating in the fairly near future.

Beginning gently, there are some  
**running repairs, maintenance and tidying jobs**  
to be done.

We will be looking for practical help to do these over the coming weeks, starting on **Saturday 20th February, 2-4 pm**, with various small tasks, observing proper distancing and sanitising precautions.  
**Please come and help if you can.**

Copies of the QI report will be available for anyone interested to see the detailed description of the church and the work that is needed.

You don't have to be a talented artist (but if anyone is that would be a bonus!) we just thought it would be a nice idea to brighten up the bus shelter. Obviously this project will commence when lockdown restrictions are eased.

The Councillors believe that **parking in the village** is currently the biggest concern in Huggate. Whilst they have their own ideas of how this can be solved, they are interested to hear of any suggestions / ideas from parishioners. In the short term, as an attempt to keep the excessive number of cars out Huggate, polite notices will be placed on the windscreens of visiting cars which are not parked safely or considerately to ask them to instead park on the tank pads or the grass verges on the entrances to the village. This has been trialled before, however it was decided that it wouldn't do any harm to re-introduce this especially as, when the weather improves, it is expected that there will be more visitors to Huggate.

## Fake Text re - Covid-19 Test

A dangerous fake NHS text has been circulating, telling people they're eligible to apply for the COVID-19 vaccine. Here's what it looks like.

This URL takes you through to an extremely convincing fake NHS website that asks for your personal details

Wednesday, 30 December 2020

**A** NHS: We have identified that you are eligible to apply for your vaccine. For more information and to apply, follow here: [uk-application-form.com](http://uk-application-form.com)

**NEVER give out your personal details.** With the recent approval of multiple vaccines in the UK, these types of scam attempts are likely to continue as fraudsters look to take advantage of the rollout to so many people. Cold calls regarding the vaccine are also beginning to take place – we've already had reports of scammers asking people to pay for it over the phone. If you receive one of these calls, hang up.
