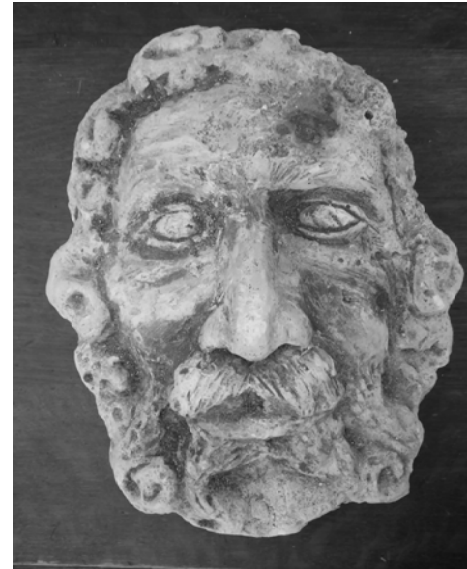
CLERK TO THE COUNCIL

- All councillors agreed to send photos of the work to the Clerk that has not been carried out on the pot holes within the village and request if dates available for works to be finished from street scene

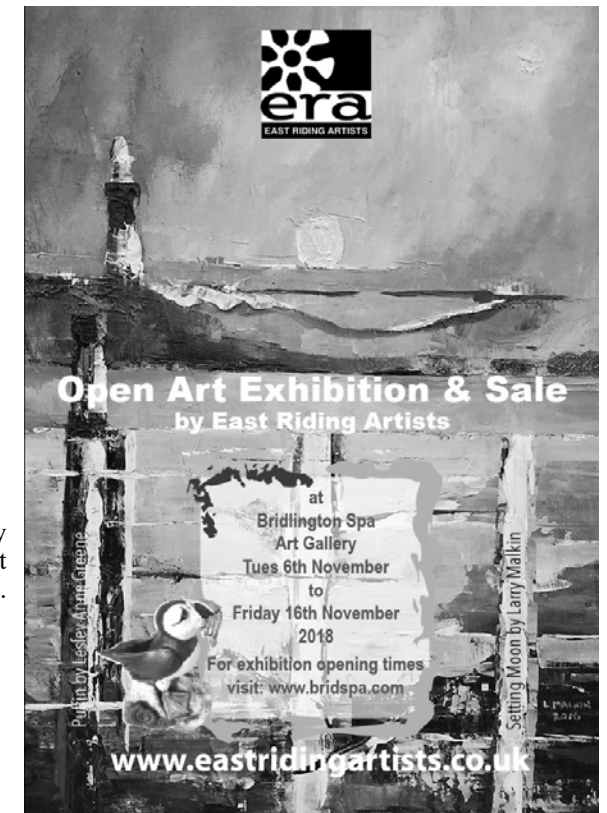


Please keep our ducks healthy and our Mere clean. Feed them stale veg not stale bread!
