Parish Council News

This year's Planting by the Pond session will take place on Sunday 18th October at 2pm. The Councillors have used the money kindly donated by the Bilton Team at TLC Pizzas and some of the village precept to purchase some bulbs to plant in order to keep the village looking its best. Current COVID-19 guidelines and regulations will be adhered to, please just bring along any useful garden tools (e.g. dibbers, trowels) and meet near the lower soak away pond. Everyone is invited to come along and help!

Councillors have noticed a large amount of dust on the roads near Huggate Quarry, this has been reported to environmental health at ERYC. They are unable to investigate complaints relating to highways only those relating to residential homes, therefore if any residents are affected by the chalk from the Quarry and levels of dust at their homes then please let Abby know (clerk-huggate@outlook.com) and she will pass your details on to Environment Health who can then start their investigations.

The Councillors have agreed on a very reasonable and local supplier for the basket swing on the Green. A site visit is being arranged in order to progress with the purchase and installation. Unfortunately it appears that funding options for purchases such as these are no longer widely available due to the current COVID situation, therefore funds will be used from the Village Amenities Fund and the Parish Council Precept.

ERYC has confirmed that Huggate is eligible for their "speed management procedure" which will enable temporary speed indicator signs to be used for a month, however the Parish Council have been told that there is a waiting list. We will let you know more about this when anything definite has been confirmed. ERYC has confirmed that they will repaint / replace the faded 30mph signs in the village. In the meantime Councillors are progressing with purchasing signs / easels which will be displayed in the village in an attempt to address speeding.

If anyone wants to report a suspicious vehicle then they need to ring the non emergency number 101 at the time it is occurring so that it can be logged. If it's safe to do so then the vehicle registration number and colour /model need to be reported so that any checks can be made.
