# Parish Council News

**What3words:** Following a recent, local, and very serious incident we'd like to remind you about what3words and how useful this app can be in an emergency situation. The app can be used offline (no internet connection is needed, therefore is suited to areas with an unreliable phone signal). **Emergency Services across the UK are now using these 3 word addresses to easily find and share precise locations.** If you get into difficulty (whilst out walking, for example), and need to contact the emergency services, the what3words app can be used to inform the call handler of your exact location, they can then quickly coordinate a response directly to the exact location where help is needed. The what3words app has labelled every 3mx3m square in the world with an address made up of three random words from the dictionary. All you need to do is download the free what3words app. You will be able to see and share the 3-word address of your current location and also to find out the 3-word address of your home (by typing in your address and selecting the square containing your front door). Be aware of a growing trend of criminals taking advantage of the current Covid-19 crisis to defraud innocent people, including the new NHS Test and Trace service. The NHS Test and Trace service has been introduced to allow the NHS to trace the spread of the virus, isolate new infections and give early warning if the virus is increasing again.

However, **scammers** are now making phone calls, sending texts and emails pretending to be from NHS Test and Trace in order to obtain your personal details.

## **Genuine NHS contact tracers will:**

- call you from 0300 013 5000  
*{Be aware that this number can be cloned; do not rely on Caller Display, always check by using the reference number given to sign in to the NHS Test and Trace web site <https://contact-tracing.phe.gov.uk> }*
- send you text messages from 'NHS'
- ask you to sign into the NHS test and trace contact-tracing website  
*{type the address <https://contact-tracing.phe.gov.uk> into your browser, do not rely on a link}*
- ask for your full name and date of birth to confirm your identity, and postcode to offer support while self-isolating
- ask about the coronavirus symptoms you have been experiencing
- ask you to provide the name, telephone number and/or email address of anyone you have had close contact with in the two days prior to your symptoms starting
- ask if anyone you have been in contact with is under 18 or lives outside of England

## **Contact tracers will never:**

- ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to them (for example, those starting 09 or 087)
- ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product of any kind
- ask for any details about your bank account
- ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
- ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone
- disclose any of your personal or medical information to your contacts
- provide medical advice on the treatment of any potential coronavirus symptoms
- ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else
- ask you to access any website that does not belong to the government or NHS
